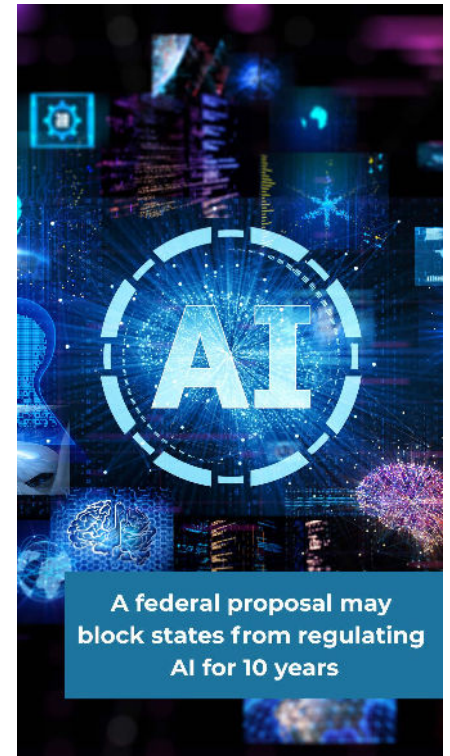

Colorado's artificial intelligence law faces uncertain future

A new Colorado law regulating artificial intelligence, set to take effect in 2026, faces an uncertain future as federal lawmakers consider overriding state authority and local stakeholders call for delays or revisions.

- Colorado was the first state to pass a comprehensive AI regulation law in 2024.
- The law requires companies to disclose AI use and allows consumers to challenge biased systems.
- Tech leaders want the law delayed to 2027, citing economic and compliance concerns.
- Efforts to revise the law failed during the last legislative session.
- A federal proposal may block states from regulating AI for 10 years, potentially overriding Colorado's law.
